



Workplace Safety Guide



Workplace safety starts with you!



Safety First



From large developments to small jobs, safety practices must be observed. Working on boundary fences or screens is important as the works impact on more than just your privacy or safety.

Before starting work it should be clear as to the forms of temporary fencing or barricading that may be required during the course of the work. Temporary fencing may be required to retain household pets, protect residents or restrict public access.

Thought must be given to the safety of neighbours or the public due to the risk posed from the proposed works. It is also advised to have on hand a suitable first aid kit in case of emergencies.

Below is a list of suggestions designed to comply with the workplace safety act and the relevant parts should be applied.

Work Area Precautions



Barricade or fence off the work area

All excavated holes should be covered outside of work hours

Use earmuffs, safety glasses and dust masks where required

Always wear suitable clothing and safety footwear

Do not allow children inside the work area

Safety warning signs should be erected where the project meets public land.

A Guide To Warning Signs For Building Sites



Hearing Protection

Display when use of power tools or other loud tools are required



Face Protection

Display when using power tools, grinding or welding equipment.



Eye Protection

Display when use of safety eyewear is required.



Foot Protection

Display when use of power tools or other loud tools are required



Hand Protection

Display when use of hand protection is required



Safety Harness

Safety harness must be worn when working above 2.4m above ground level, unless working off fenced scaffolding.



Head Protection

Hard hats must be worn when working on projects where risk of head impact, or falling objects are possible.
